



## **Ramaco Carbon: Thank You, Sheridan County**

On March 6, Sheridan County commissioners voted to approve a rezoning of Ramaco Carbon's property, allowing the company's proposed research and light manufacturing facilities — iPark and iCam — to move forward.

The following is a statement by CEO Randall Atkins:
